#### DIVIDEND:

Due to inadequacy of profits, your Directors have not recommended any dividend for the period under review

#### **OPERATIONS:**

During the period under review, your company has undertaken the project awarded by National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) for construction of 9 km long road tunnel between Chenani and Nashri of NH-1A in the state of Jammu & Kashmir on Design Build Finance Operate & Transfer (DBFOT) on annuity basis. The project has a concession period of 20 years with total project cost of ₹3720 Crores. The financial closure for the project was achieved on November 14, 2010. The project cost is met through a combination of Debt (Senior Debt of ₹2,976 Crores and Subordinate debt of ₹372 Crores) and promoter's contribution of ₹372 Crores. The Company achieved physical progress of 10.12% till March 31, 2011.

#### **DIRECTORS:**

Mr. Ajay Menon, Mr. Ravi Sreehari and Mr. Krishna Ghag were appointed as the first directors of the Company by the Articles of Association. During the period under review, Mr. Mukund Sapre and Mr. Gopalkrishnan Vishwanathan were appointed as Additional Directors on the Board of the Company with effect from July 27, 2010 and January 25, 2011,

respectively. Mr. Gopalkrishnan Viswanathan was also appointed as Managing Director of the Company for a period of five years with effect from January 25, 2011.

# CONSTITUTION OF AUDIT COMMITTEE

During the period under review, Audit Committee comprising of Mr. Mukund Sapre, Mr. Krishna Ghag, and Mr. Ajay Menon was constituted on January 25, 2011.

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of CHENANI NASHRI TUNNELWAY LIMITED as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2011, the Profit and loss account and the Cash Flow Statement for the period ended on that date annexed thereto. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Company's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. We conducted our audit in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in India. 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# Schedule – F: Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Financial Statements

## Background:

The Company was incorporated under the Companies Act 1956 on June 02, 2010. The Company is a special purpose vehicle (SPV) promoted by IL&FS Transportation Networks Limited (ITNL). The Company has entered into a Concession Agreement (CA) on June 29, 2010 with The National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) for Rehabilitation, Strengthening and four laning of Chenani to Nashri Section of NH-1A, from km 89.00 to km 130.00(New Alignment) including 9km long tunnel (2 lane) with parallel escape tunnel on Design, Build, Finance, Operate and Transfer (DBFOT basis) in the state of Jammu & Kashmir. The Concession Agreement envisages concession for a period of 20 years commencing from the 'Appointed date', including construction period of 1825 days required for the Project.

# Significant Accounting Policies:

#### 1. Basis of Accounting

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and comply with the Accounting Standards ('AS') specified in the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006 notified by the Central Government in terms of Section 211(3C) of the Companies Act, 1956, to the extent applicable. The Company generally follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties or otherwise accounted for on cash basis.

#### 2. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets, liabilities, revenues and expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of financial statements. The recognition, measurement, classification or disclosures of an item or information in the financial statements have been made relying on these estimates to a greater extent.

#### 3. Revenue Recognition

The Concession Agreement envisages Revenue in the form of Annuity of a fixed sum on pre-determined dates (not more than twice a year). The Annuity payment will start accruing to the Company, six months after the Commercial Operation Date ("COD"). As the Project is still under construction stage, no revenue has been recognised.

#### 4. Fixed Assets

All fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. For this purpose cost includes purchase price and all other attributable costs of bringing assets into working condition and location for intended use. Assessment of indication of impairment of an asset is made as at the reporting date and impairment loss, if any is recognised.

#### 5. Capital Work-in-Progress

Capital Work–in–progress includes direct and attributable expenses for construction of Road net off interest earned on Fixed Deposit.

#### 6. Impairment of Assets

The carrying values of assets of the Company's cash-generating units are reviewed for impairment annually or more often if there is an indication of decline in value. If any indication of such impairment exists, the recoverable amounts of those assets are estimated and impairment loss is recognised, if the carrying amount of those assets exceeds their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the estimated future cash flows to their present value based on appropriate discount factor.

#### 7. Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs attributable to construction of the road are treated as a part of Capital Work in progress for subsequent capitalization on commencement of commercial operations of the road.

#### 8. Preliminary Expenditure

Preliminary Expenses incurred on incorporation of the Company are charged to the Profit & Loss Account for the period during which these expenses are incurred.

#### 9. Accounting for Taxes on Income

Provision for current income tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income - tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax resulting from "timing differences" between book and tax profits is accounted for using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward only if there is a virtual/ reasonable certainty that the assets will be realized in future. The carrying amount of deferred tax asset is reviewed at each balance sheet date.

#### 10. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Assets

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires outflow of resources, which can be reliably estimated. Disclosures for a contingent liability is made, without a provision in books, when there is an obligation that may, but probably will not, require outflow of resources. Contingent Assets are neither recognised nor disclosed.

#### 11. Cash Flow Statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby net profits / loss before tax are adjusted for the effect of transaction of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The Cash flows from regular revenue generating; investing and financing activities are segregated.

Cash and cash equivalents in the cash flow statement comprises of cash at bank and in hand and term deposits with banks, if any.

#### 12. Earnings per Share (EPS)

Basic Earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit / (loss) after tax for the year attributable to equity shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of equity shares issued during the year.

The number of shares used in computing Diluted EPS comprises the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving Basic EPS and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued on the conversion of all Dilutive potential equity shares. Dilutive potential shares are deemed to be converted as at the beginning of the period unless issued at a later date.

# Notes forming part of Accounts:

#### 1. Segment Reporting
